

**ORDINANCE NO. 20-2012**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HARRISON,  
COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER, STATE OF NEW JERSEY DEDICATING AND DESIGNATING  
THE JUGHANDLE ROAD FROM ROUTE 322 TO LAMBS ROAD (C.R. 635) AS  
“PFC SICKLER LANE” IN RECOGNITION OF PFC CHARLES S. SICKLER**

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Harrison find it to be appropriate and proper to honor veterans from Harrison Township; and

**WHEREAS**, Charles S. “Stevie” Sickler lived in Ewan and graduated from Clearview Regional High School in June 1967; and

**WHEREAS**, Charles S. Sickler entered the Marine Corps in September of 1967; and

**WHEREAS**, on December 22, 1967 PFC Charles S. Sickler left for his duty assignment in Vietnam, and was assigned to Company C, 3<sup>rd</sup> Shore Party Battalion, 3<sup>rd</sup> Marine Division, which unit provided convoy security in Quang Nam Province, in the northern sector of South Vietnam; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 13, 1968, just twenty-two days after he arrived in Vietnam, PFC Charles S. Sickler was killed when a mine exploded under the vehicle in which he was riding; and

**WHEREAS**, it is an honor and privilege for the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Harrison to rename the jughandle road from Route 322 to Lambs Road (C.R. 635) as “PFC Sickler Lane” in honor and dedication of the sacrifice Charles S. Sickler gave our country.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Harrison as follows:

**Section 1.**

The jughandle road from Route 322 to Lambs Road (C.R. 635) shall be dedicated and designated as “PFC Sickler Lane”.

**Section 2.**

Upon adoption of this Ordinance, the Public Works Department shall cause to have erected appropriate signage to make the general public aware of the dedication described in this Ordinance.

**Section 3.**

**Repealer.**

All prior Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

**Section 4.**

**Severability.**

Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

**Section 5.**

**When effective.**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.
