## FENCE REQUIREMENTS Harrison Township Ordinance §113-8

As a general rule, fences do not require building permits. However, there are specific regulations regarding the placement of fences.

- No fence may exceed six feet in height without a variance from the Zoning Board of Adjustment. A fence higher than six feet will also require building permits.
- No fence higher than four feet may be placed in the front yard in a residential zone. The front yard begins at the front corner of the dwelling.
- All sides of a lot adjacent to streets shall be considered as front yards for purposes of determining setbacks and placement of fences.
- No fence higher than four feet shall be erected along a public right-of-way and shall be set back at least five feet from the property line. The right-of-way is considered to be that area occupied by a road, sidewalk, or other similar uses.
- Fences shall not cause the flow of natural drainage to be blocked or dammed to create ponding. Fences shall not be placed in easements where the placement of a structure is prohibited or in sight triangles.
- Fences shall be erected with the finished side away from the property and the structural side toward the interior of the property.
- Fence gates shall have a latch and shall open into the property and not onto the sidewalk, street, or other adjacent property.
- Fences must be maintained on both sides to be safe, sound and in an upright condition.
- Living fences shall not be planted closer than four feet to the property line and shall not encroach over a sidewalk or beyond a property line. Living fences shall be maintained in a neatly trimmed condition.
